Statement 1 or 2 cannot be the starting statement because the starting statement sets the scene of the passage or gives us an idea for argument. Statement 1 starts with 'This is the last of the.....'. The 'This' in the statement gives us the alert that there should be a sentence before that. Now,

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we look at statement 2, and we see that statement 2 is bound to come after statement 1 as the concluding statement. Now look at statement C. This says about an agreement that was signed at the talks mentioned in the passage. Now, sentence 1 says that it was the last of the four agreements signed between the two countries. So, logically, statement 1 comes after statement C. The correct sequence becomes ABC12. This makes option D the correct answer.

28. Answer: A

The question is a pretty simple one. Sentence 1 says that the Jammu and Kashmir police identified the three as so and so. This means it cannot be the opening sentence as there should be some sentence referring to the three as mentioned in Statement 1. Now, let us look at Statement 2. It says that three BJP functionaries in South Kashmir's Kulgam district were shot by terrorists on Thursday evening. Ok, this can be the opening statement. Now, look at statement A. It starts with 'The three included...'. This means that it should come after statement 2 and B and C should follow statement A. The correct sequence will be 2ABC1. This makes option A the right answer.

The agricultural crop year in India is from July to June. The Indian cropping season is classified into two main seasons-(i) Kharif and (ii) Rabi based on the monsoon. The kharif cropping season is from July –October during the south-west monsoon and the Rabi cropping season is

from October-March (winter). The crops grown between March and June are summer crops. Pakistan and Bangladesh are two other countries that are using the term 'kharif' and 'rabi' to describe about their cropping patterns. The terms 'kharif' and 'rabi' originate from Arabic language where Kharif means autumn and Rabi means spring.

DBEAC is the correct sequence.

Sentence D begins the paragraph with an introduction to the Indian cropping season.

Sentence B logically follows Sentence D as the sentence D presents the information about monsoon and months associated with it in India.

Sentences B and E are pair. Both the sentences discuss the winter and summer crops.

Sentence A expands the scope of the paragraph with the details related to names of Pakistan and Bangladesh monsoon. And Sentence C defines the terms 'kharif' and 'rabi'. It can be perceived as a closing statement.

Linking A to E:

Sentence E reveals that the campaign was taken by Obama on behalf of Biden who was not able to attend as he was preparing for meetings and debate with Trump on Thursday. This sentence seems logical to be put after A owing to the fact that it gives an explanation of why Biden could not be present.

Linking E to F:

The paragraph now smartly gives a description of the driving alley where the rally took place. If not observed carefully, this sentence can create confusion about its placement at the first or the last. But since the first four sentences are easily identified one after the other, this sentence comes in the fifth place and gives a sense that the paragraph is going to end.

Linking F to C:

The paragraph concludes by saying that it was the largest campaign to take place amidst the pandemic. This seems to be a correct conclusion and is easily deciphered to come at the end of the paragraph.

The sentences after rearrangement will be B-D-A-E-F-C.
